Minutes of the sixth meeting of the Board of Studies of the Department of Political Science of Ramakrishna Mission Vidyamandira held on 17 May 2017 at 2.15pm at the Saradananda Conference Hall in Vidyamandira

The meeting was chaired by the Head of the Department and Chairperson of the Board of Studies of the Department of Political Science, Professor Indrashis Banerjee.

Item (a): Confirmation of the proceedings of the fifth BOS meeting held on 14 May, 2016

The minutes of the third meeting of the Board of Studies held on 14 May, 2016 was read by Professor Indrashis Banerjee. It was unanimously accepted and ratified by the house.

The Chairperson informed the house that a RUSA sponsored national level seminar titled "Interrogating Intolerance" was organized by the Department on 3 March, 2017 as part of the Platinum Jubilee celebrations of the college. He further stated that the proceedings of the seminar would be published hopefully by September, 2017.

Item (b): Review of the Syllabi for Honours and General Courses

Professor Indrashis Banerjee placed his opinion before the house as to whether sub-topic on French President could be excluded from the syllabus of Paper VIII - Comparative Government and Politics. Professor Sovanlal Dattagupta felt that the topic should be retained in the syllabus as French Presidency should ideally be compared with the US Presidency. So no change was made. Professor Indrashis Banerjee requested the house to explore whether the constitution of the People's Republic of Bangladesh could be included in the syllabus, to which, after a brief discussion, the house observed that focus remained on constitutions which had passed the test of time.

As per the proposals presented at a recently held Open Forum at the Department by the Third Year honours students the following modifications on the Paper II - Indian Political Thought and Movement were made:
