Tirathnath Lala the trader gives five rupees, Harbans Chadha the owner of the brick kiln gives five rupees, Anwar the fruit-seller gives five rupees. Yet every year the contestants stay up the night eating pork and rice – the meat of this pig and a couple more that they slaughter – and drinking liquor. The Daroga is annually astonished that there is never a quarrel between the winners and the losers.
